



Creating Joined Reports in Reflexx

What is a joined report?

A joined report combines data from two separate reports into one report. For example, you may wish to have HIV Testing data and Referral data in one report instead of running two reports separately.

Why would I create a joined report?

You would create a joined report if there's not a single report you can run in Reflexx that contains all the data you need. Running a joined report prevents you from having to run two separate reports and then combining them manually into one by copying and pasting data.

What criteria are necessary for creating a joined report in Reflexx?

To create a joined report, the two separate reports must have at least one client identification variable in common. For example, among the various reports in Reflexx are a Clients report and a Session/Contacts report. These reports have the variable EWID (EvaluationWeb ID) in common and therefore you would be able to combine them into a joined report.

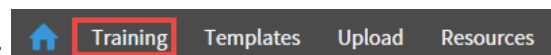
